### The Epistle Lesson

Philippians 2:1–11 (NRSV) If then, there is any comfort in Christ, any consolation from love, any partnership in the Spirit, any tender affection and sympathy, <sup>2</sup> make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. <sup>3</sup> Do nothing from selfish ambition or empty conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. <sup>4</sup> Let each of you look not to your own interests but to the interests of others. <sup>5</sup> Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who, though He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be grasped, <sup>7</sup> but emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave, assuming human likeness. And being found in appearance as a human, <sup>8</sup> He humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross. <sup>9</sup> Therefore God exalted Him even more highly and gave Him the name that is above every other name, <sup>10</sup> so that at the name given to Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup> and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

### + The Gospel Lesson

Mark 1:1-11 (NRSV) The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ. <sup>2</sup> As it is written in the prophet Isaiah, "See, I am sending My messenger ahead of You, who will prepare Your way, <sup>3</sup> the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make His paths straight."<sup>4</sup> So John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. <sup>5</sup> And the whole Judean region and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him and were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins. <sup>6</sup> Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. <sup>7</sup> He proclaimed, "The One who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the strap of His sandals.<sup>8</sup> I have baptized you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." <sup>9</sup> In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. <sup>10</sup> And just as He was coming up out of the water, He saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove upon Him. <sup>11</sup> And a voice came from the heavens, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with You I am well pleased."


