The Epistle Lesson Hebrews 9:11—14, 24—28 (NRSV)

But when Christ came as a high priest of the good things that have come, ¹² He entered once for all into the holy place, not with the blood of goats and calves but with His own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. ¹³ For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of the ashes of a heifer sanctifies those who have been defiled so that their flesh is purified, ¹⁴ how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, purify our conscience from dead works to worship the living God! ²⁴ For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but He entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. ²⁵ Nor was it to offer Himself again and again, as the high priest enters the holy place year after year with blood that is not his own, ²⁶ for then He would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, He has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to remove sin by the sacrifice of Himself. ²⁷ And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once and after that the judgment, ²⁸ so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for Him.
