



Love is patient and kind.

1 Corinthians 13:4, ESV

"This is My commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you." John 15:12

I am a failure when it comes to love. I must confess that I do not get love right most times. I can show flashes of it from time to time; however, I can not say I have love down!

Jesus commands that we love one another. This is an action. It calls us to behave toward others as Christ behaved toward us. Not an easy thing for me to do for sure. When I think how Jesus loves me, I am overwhelmed with the reality that I have a lot to learn. So how does Jesus show His love to me (us)? Let us consider a few of these as we continue through 2026.

First, **He empties Himself into me.** He does not hold back anything that will be for my good. He offers His Word for instruction. He extends grace to me when I least deserve anything He has to offer. He fills me with His Spirit to enable me to press on in this life. He gifts me with love.

Next, **He shows by example the visible reality of what it means to love.** He reaches to the needy and distraught with compassion. He offers hope to the hopeless. He blesses with healing. There is little left to imagining what love is when I observe Him ministering as He does throughout the pages of Scripture.

Ultimately, **He was willing to go to a cross for me.** He offered Himself a sacrifice on my behalf so that I would have the opportunity to return to a right relationship with the Heavenly Father. His death on Calvary enables me to be right with Him! ***"Amazing love, how can it be, that Thou, my God, should die for me."*** (from *And Can It Be* – Charles Wesley)

If I need to know what it is to love, I only have to look to Jesus. And yet, to know love, authentic love, I can look to the scriptures. Paul in 1 Corinthians 13 (Love chapter) explains this real love – **"agape"** – so that I can know how to love. Please note that here in this scripture, love is a noun. It is the subject that gets the attention. Then Paul adds a few adjectives to get my attention. Love is – patient, kind, not jealous, does not brag, it is not arrogant, it is behaving at one's best, not selfish, forgives, does not applaud sin – among other things, it is hopeful and enduring. Then Paul ends with this truth – "love never fails."

Finally, **love is a desire of the will.** I must choose love and commit to loving others as Christ has loved me. I am a failure at this. But, with God's help, I strive to be better!

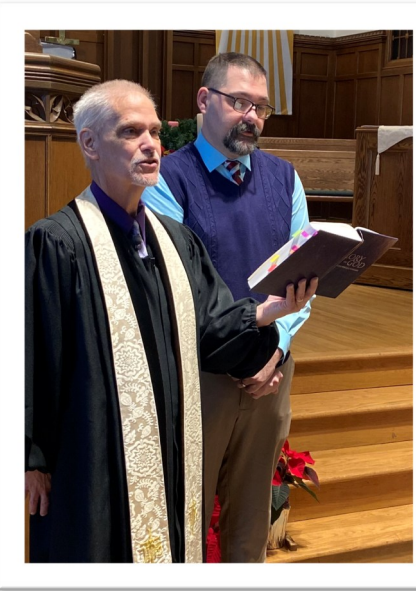

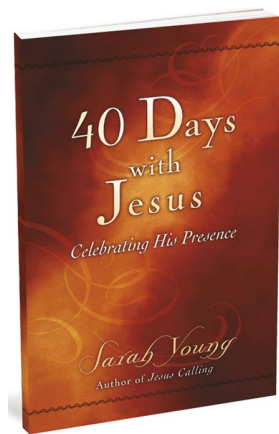
Join Us For Brunch!

Ash Wednesday Service

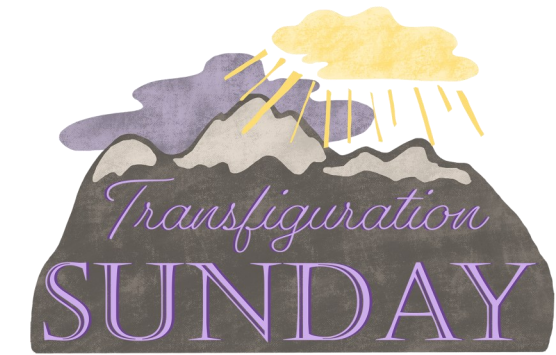
