

3rd Sunday – <u>Clean Start Program</u> offers mail service for people who have no permanent address, as well as cleaning supplies and hygiene items to those who would not otherwise be able to afford them. It also offers private bathrooms where homeless individuals can shower in dignity.

4th Sunday – <u>**CAReS**</u> (Community Assistance & Referral Service, Inc.) is a community-based nonprofit agency housed in The Neighborhood building on Carter Avenue, that identifies, coordinates, and mobilizes resources for individuals and families in emergency/crisis situations.

5th Sunday – FPC Carpet Fund
