[†] **The Gospel Lesson:** Mark 10:35–37, 41–45 (NRSV)
James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Him and said to Him, "Teacher, we want You to do for us whatever we ask of You." ³⁶ And He said to them, "What is it you want Me to do for

you?" ³⁷ And they said to Him, "Appoint us to sit, one at Your right hand and one at Your left, in Your glory." ⁴¹ When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. ⁴² So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. ⁴³ But it is not so among you; instead, whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. ⁴⁵ For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give His life a ransom for many."
