After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. ² And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³ His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. ⁴ For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. ⁵ But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. ⁷ Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead...' (Matthew 28:1-7b)

he journey continues for us as we make our way to the cross. Once we get there, the journey will continue through an empty tomb and a resurrected Jesus! What an exciting time for us as we continue our faith walk with the Lord. hear the direction for our hearts and lives today? The vibrancy of the first words are that which gives our hope a powerful assurance. "He is risen" communicates the reality of God's power and purpose for the world. Jesus who was crucified, died and buried is alive now and forever! "Come and see" is the invitation of a God who wants us to believe without doubting. He desires that we be assured that His word is true and His power to overcome is unshakeable! "Go and tell" is the charge we are given to tell our story that is rooted in His story. We are given the joyful response of telling the resurrection story that fills our hearts today. Is Jesus real in our hearts? Then we must tell it to everyone who will hear. We have hope, joy and life flooding our spirits and overflowing in the love of God. We cannot keep it to ourselves.

Over the next few weeks, we are privileged to participate in the passion, power and promise of God. It is why He created you and me. It is why He offered Himself for us. It is why we can sing with jubilant hearts and voices the words of a great hymn— *"Because He lives, I can face tomorrow, because He lives all fear is gone; because I know He holds the future, and life is worth the living just because He lives!"*
