Isaiah 40:27-31 (NRSV)

Why do you say, O Jacob, and assert, O Israel, "My way is hidden from the LORD, and my right is disregarded by my God"? ²⁸ Have you not known? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; His understanding is unsearchable. ²⁹ He gives power to the faint and strengthens the powerless. ³⁰ Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted, ³¹ but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.

Mark 1:29–39 (NRSV)

As soon as they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. 30 Now Simon's motherin-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. ³¹ He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them. ³² That evening, at sunset, they brought to Him all who were sick or possessed by demons. ³³ And the whole city was gathered around the door. ³⁴ And He cured many who were sick with various diseases and cast out many demons, and He would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew Him. ³⁵ In the morning, while it was still very dark, He got up and went out to a deserted place, and there He prayed. ³⁶ And Simon and his companions hunted for Him. ³⁷ When they found Him, they said to Him, "Everyone is searching for You." 38 He answered, "Let us go on to the neighboring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also, for that is what I came out to do." 39 And He went throughout all Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons.
