

† **The Gospel Lesson**

Mark 1:1–5, 9–15 (NRSV)

The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ. ² As it is written in the prophet Isaiah, “See, I am sending My messenger ahead of You, who will prepare Your way,” ³ the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: ‘Prepare the way of the Lord; make His paths straight,’ ” ⁴ so John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ And the whole Judean region and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him and were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁹ In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ And just as He was coming up out of the water, He saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove upon Him. ¹¹ And a voice came from the heavens, “You are My Son, the Beloved; with You I am well pleased.” ¹² And the Spirit immediately drove Him out into the wilderness. ¹³ He was in the wilderness forty days, tested by Satan, and He was with the wild beasts, and the angels waited on Him. ¹⁴ Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the good news of God ¹⁵ and saying, “The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news.”




